



Paedophile jailed again

Brian White, of 36 Town Rd St Peters, Brigstow, was today sentenced at Brigstow Crown Court to 12 years in prison for his third paedophile conviction. He was found guilty of repeatedly raping a 12 year old girl (B) over a 3 year period.

He had targeted the family as the girl was living with her alcoholic mother and younger brother after her father had died in a drink driving accident. The abuse had begun within a year of him being released early from prison after being convicted of raping an 8 year old girl.

The court heard how he befriended B's mother and then groomed B over a period of months by buying her presents such as clothes, meals and hair

styling. He bought B a mobile phone so he could contact her without her mother knowing. He even took the mother and daughter away on holiday to Blackpool and repeatedly raped the girl while her mother was out drinking in various bars. White had spent large amounts of money on B but had no visible means of support.

Large quantities of pornographic material were found in White's house mostly featuring children. Forensic analysis of his computer confirmed he was a frequent user of child pornography sites.

The girl finally told a close friend of the family what was happening to her and only then were the police involved. She also complained that

White would bring other men to the house when she was visiting him and they in turn raped her but she has been unable to identify any of them. White denied the involvement of other men. The police are carrying out further investigations.

More Bendy-Bus Shocks

The Herald has learnt that Brigstow City Council will have to borrow £35m from the Government Public Works Loan Board to finance its bendy bus schemes. This loan will be repaid over a quarter of a century and the interest due on that will bring the total repayments to £63m.

Assault victim fights for life

A 52 year old man is to-day fighting for his life in the Brigstow Royal Infirmary after being found unconscious in Brigg Park in central Brigstow. He was found at 11 am yesterday lying in some-trees by the river bank but within a few yards of the busy Park Road.
